General Summary:

The Water World Maintenance Specialist II reports directly to the Water World Maintenance Foreman. This position supports all aspects related to the safe and efficient mechanical operation of Water World, including the day-to-day operations of the facility. The specific duties and responsibilities are outlined below.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities:

1. Performs routine maintenance, repair, and diagnostics on Water World and other District swimming pools, equipment and grounds, including but not limited to plumbing, chemical feeders, filters, boilers, electrical equipment, ozone generation equipment, chemical controllers, pump stations, and fiberglass filters.
2. Conducts regular walkthroughs of facilities to ensure appropriate appearance and needed maintenance and repairs.
3. Assists with pre-season preparation and daily operation of pools as well as post-season winterization of outdoor pools.
4. Performs rough carpentry in construction of miscellaneous projects.
5. Utilizes general aquatics equipment including, but not limited to swimming pool pumps, boilers, filters and related valving system, chemical feed and monitoring equipment, general pool maintenance equipment including manual and automatic vacuuming systems, hydro washers, and general pool deck equipment.
6. Assists with maintaining mechanical equipment such as pumps, motors, engines, boilers, piping, valves and instrumentation.
7. Operates mechanical equipment including but not limited to trucks, trailers, front end loaders, jackhammer, compressor, backhoe tractors and trenchers.
8. Other power tools used, including but not limited to, chain, skill, table, and concrete saws; sander, grinders, sprayer drill, float trowel, joints, and auger.
9. Performs other duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities Required:

1. Mid-level expertise in one of the following disciplines: carpentry, irrigation, plumbing, pump mechanics or electrical.
2. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relations with other District staff and the general public
3. Ability to work under minimal supervisions and assume responsibility for task initiative and completion.
4. Ability to make sound decisions and use good judgment in stressful situations.
5. Knowledge of facility maintenance and repairs.
6. Must be able to work more than 40 hours per week, as required, but particularly from April through October; including weekends.

Work Environment & Physical Activities:

1. Must be able to lift bags of chemicals weighing 50 pounds to a height of 3.5 feet.
2. Must be able to hear emergency signal devices, hear voice calls for help or assistance, recognize dangerous situations from listening to crowd noises, and recognize odd or unusual sounds in standard pool equipment and machinery.
3. Must be able to smell unusual odors generated by malfunctioning equipment or chemical reactions.
4. Must be able to give clear verbal instructions up to a distance of 200 feet.
5. Must be able to climb and work at heights up to 50 feet.

Education, Training, Certifications:

1. Valid Colorado Drivers License required.
2. Minimum of one-year experience in aquatics maintenance including water quality.
3. Certified Pool Operator or Aquatics Facility Operator Certificate required or must be obtained within six months of employment.
4. Experience in pool operation or facility maintenance or construction required.
5. Experience maintaining mechanical equipment such as pumps, motors, engines, boilers, piping, valves and instrumentation.
6. Mid-level of expertise in carpentry, irrigation, and/or plumbing.
